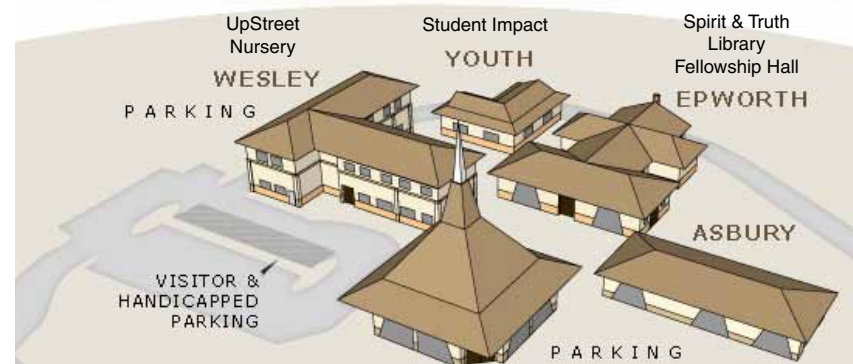

THE UNLEASHING OF A DANGEROUS NEW IDEA

When Martin Luther placed his Ninety-five Theses on the Door of Wittenburg College, Germany, on Oct 31, 1517 he unleashed a dangerous new idea — that all Christians had the right to interpret the Bible for themselves, placing the Bible in the hands of the laity. Luther's theses circulated throughout Europe setting off a firestorm of a vast revolution bringing radical reform to the Christian Church known as The Protestant Reformation.

We Methodists are a protestant Church deeply indebted to the 16th century Reformers who have greatly influenced our theology, sacraments, liturgy, use of Scripture and teachings.
