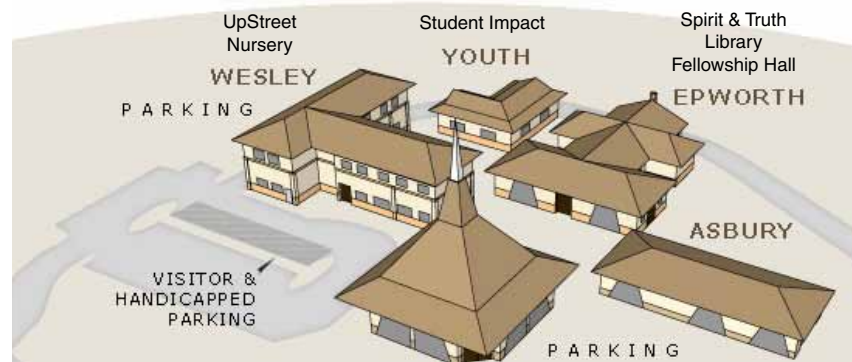

FROM OUR CHURCH ORGANIST

If you recently attended the 11:00 traditional service you may have noticed some different sounds echoing through the sanctuary. Yes, the new organ was installed! Many hours of research and prayer coupled with faithful giving from you as a congregation allowed this to happen, and what a difference. Now, there may be a small adjustment period as we work to get the volume levels appropriate for the service but even with this adjustment time I do not think that you will miss the old organ!

So what is different about this new organ? First, if you look at the organ console itself you will see that it has a smaller, more compact console and yet

it has an additional manual (keyboard). This extra manual allows more sounds to be used within an individual piece of music. Each manual, as well as the pedal division had 11 or 12 stops associated with it that you can pull out or set to use in a piece. So a second difference would be that you have a whole new set of sounds that can be used because of the extra keyboard. Then behind each of these stops, there are 3 more sounds that you can set creating the opportunity for 184 different sounds programmed into the organ. In addition, there is a midi module that has hundreds of more sounds that can be as well. Because the quality of these sounds is so clear and distinct, one can really appreciate the differences as they are used within worship. During communion last week you may have heard the solo instruments of the oboe and flute used. These were orchestral sounds programmed in from the midi. The last difference that I will mention is that of the speakers. Lots of work went into the positioning of these state of the art speakers so as to be able to hear the organ at the same level anywhere you are in the room. Just that alone would have brought a huge improvement!

I have really enjoyed exploring this new instrument over the last week and experimenting with the different sound combinations it can make. I have learned a lot but there is a lot more to be able to utilize still. Thank you all for making this happen. I do not think that you will have any regrets with the investment of a beautiful instrument such as this to enhance the corporate worship of our Lord.
